**Volunteers of America Chesapeake Receives Donation from BB&T
To Support the Non-Profit's Life-Changing Services**

Local Bank Donated \$5,000 to Help Those in Need in Local Community

Lanham, MD - (January 23, 2012) – Volunteers of America Chesapeake, a non-profit organization operating more than 26 health and human service programs throughout Maryland, Virginia and Washington, D.C announced today that it received a \$5,000.00 donation from BB&T.

BB&T also donated \$10,000 worth of items to improve the non-profit’s housing community’s playground, renovate the community room and create a brand new computer lab for the families.

“BB&T has a track record of supporting its high performing non-profit customers serving our local community and Volunteers of America Chesapeake fits into that category,” he added. Pascal is also on the Board of Directors for Volunteers of America Chesapeake.
